

2. UNIFORMS

- a) May I remind all parents that learners are expected to wear the full school uniform to school, everyday.
- b) Hair: Boys are to keep their hair well groomed. Hair must be short and the same length all over. No fashion hair styles are allowed.
Girls with long hair must tie it back. Only blue or white elastic bands are to be used and no extreme hairstyles are permitted.
- c) No jewellery is to be worn except black, silver or gold watches, NO novelty watches permitted. Girls with pierced ears are only allowed to wear small plain gold/silver stud earrings or sleepers. No fancy earrings with 'pretty' stones permitted. Boys are not allowed to wear earrings to school. Where applicable, medical bracelets may be worn.
- d) Only the regulation school bag and cooler bag are to be used.

3. SWIMMING

Swimming starts this term. Please ensure that your child has a black costume, blue cap and a blue school towel. Place all items in a plastic bag before placing in the school bag. If you wish your child to be excused from swimming, please send a letter giving reasons for his/her excuse.
